Imagine ~ Discover ~ Create

The theme of the sixth Rochester Area Literacy Council's (RALC) publishing opportunity, *Imagine ~ Discover ~ Create*, provides students in grades kindergarten through twelfth the opportunity to submit written or artistic work relating to their inventive, imaginative, physical, social, emotional or cultural environment. Student work may be completed at home, in school or within some other group or organization.

Specific topics, visual media, mode or genre of writing are open to an author's or artist's purpose, perspective and voice. Students might choose their inner world, an imaginary world, places (real or imagined) they would like to visit, changes they would like to see in their environment or community, people and relationships in their environment or specific topics being presented in class related to the New York State Common Core Standards.

Student entries will be evaluated for personal creativity, imagination, and knowledge. A committee of local educators will review the entries using guidelines provided in this packet and rubrics provided on the RALC web site. Selected entries will be compiled and published by the Rochester Area Literacy Council into a full color book. Each entry that is selected for publication will be awarded a complimentary copy of the book. Other copies will be offered for sale to families, friends and educators in the greater Rochester area.

Written & Visual Guidelines

- All entries must be revised, edited, and publication ready before submission. Publishable work is clear, organized and free of grammatical or technical errors. Final editing must be done under the guidance of an adult.
- 2. The rubrics describe the quality of work worthy of publication. Additional information and rubrics can be found on the RALC website <u>www.rochesterarealiteracycouncil.org</u>.
- 3. Completed K-6 entries, including the visual, should not exceed 2 pages; 7-12 entries, including the visual, should not exceed 4 pages.
- 4. Content can be presented as, but is not limited to: cartoon, drawing, painting, photograph, poem, song, memoir, satire, interview, and narrative, informative or persuasive essay.
- 5. Work must be original to the author, artist, or photographer. Multiple students' submissions of a single class assignment will not be published. The sample showing the most creativity, imagination, organization, knowledge, and voice will be selected.
- 6. Quotations and source material must be fully cited and documented. For information and guidelines about documenting resources, visit <u>www.rochesterarealiteracycouncil.org</u>.
- 7. The entries for grades K, 1 and 2 can be handwritten, but must be legible and readable. Entries selected for publication will be typed by the publisher.
- 8. The entries for grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 must be first submitted as typed paper copies (Comic Sans, black, 14 point font, 1.5 spaced). Entries selected for publication must be resubmitted electronically.
- All visual entries must be on quality <u>white</u> drawing paper, no more than 6.5 by 9, free of smudges, creases or erasures and electronically reproducible. Vibrant color visuals (colored pencils or paint) are desirable.
- 10. Visual entries separate from written text must include a title and caption or dialogue box that explains the visual's story.
- 11. Entries can be done collaboratively by two students. When two students partner, a cover sheet for each individual must be competed. One complimentary book will be given to collaborative work.
